Research Programs:

In the lab:

- What specific projects would you work on? How do these fit into the lab focus?
- Does the research program fit with your interests and passions?
- Does the work build on your previous knowledge and experience? Will you be learning anything new?
- Will these projects help you to achieve your long term career goals?

At the institution:

- What type of research is being conducted?
- What is the quality of the work of the investigators?
- o What is the research network like?
- Are there opportunities for collaboration?

Research Facilities:

What type of **equipment** will you have access to:

- o In your lab?
- o Within the institution?
- o At other locations?

Regarding shared research resources:

- o Where are they located?
- How are they maintained and funded?
- o What services are available?
- Are they overbooked or hard to get access to?
- What are the costs to use the facilities?
- o Is training available?
